How the club began

On November 19, 1970, Fredrich G. Behner, Jr., a Rotarian from Monroe, Michigan, placed ad In the Green Valley news for Rotarians to meet and discuss a new club for Green Valley.

The sponsoring club was the Old Pueblo Club of Tucson, Arizona, J. Walter Nelson, President.

Behner and District Governor William E. Craig prepared the formal application, which was hand carried to RI Evanston, Illinois by Fred Behner.

Provisional Acceptance

On January 12, 1971, official recognition of the formation of a provisional club in Green Valley was received from RI, and the first meeting was held at the Que Paso Restaurant in Green Valley.

Chartered

The official date of the charter was January 21, 1971. Charter Night ceremonial pomp and circumstance occurred at the Ramada Inn in Tucson, Arizona on February 23, 1971, coinciding with R.I. 66th birthday. Tucson Rotarians and guests numbered 196m two of who were R.I. Past Directors, Al McKeown and Reginald Smith.

Community participation

Many of the agencies in Green Valley have Rotarians as founding members or serving on their Boards - whether it is Casa de Esperanza, Valley Assistance Services, the Food Bank, White Elephant, the Community Foundation or any of the other scores of volunteer and service organizations that are in the Community, we take care of one another.

Through our local support to Rotary International (RI) and the Rotary Foundation, the club is working to eradicate polio in the world. Along with all 1,200,000 Rotarians world-wide, we have given funds to match those donated by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation in the quest to eradicate polio.,

Women in Rotary

Since R.I.'s admittance of women into membership in 1987, the Club has been presided over by three women. Approximately 25% of the club's members are women. Women have been District Governors of District 5500, the R.I. district inclusive the clubs in the lower 1/3rd of the State of Arizona.
